U. S. Senate Legislative Update

Once again, the Obama administration has gone around Congress to further its agenda. Since the Senate had failed to pass Obama's Cap and Trade legislation, Obama passed it through the backdoor via EPA regulations. Senator Murkowski (R- AK) sponsored SJ Resolution 26, "Senate Joint Resolution 26", to block and overturn the EPA's "global warming" regulations. On June 10th, SJ Resolution 26 was defeated. The U.S. Senate voted to allow the Obama administration's EPA to take control of America's energy and economic future. Fifty-three (53) Senators voted to allow the unelected, unaccountable EPA to regulate greenhouse gases. Please keep in mind that the "science" behind "man-made global warming" has been discredited. Legitimate scientific data shows that solar cycles and ocean cycles (not greenhouse gases) account for temperature fluctuations.

All forty-one Republican Senators and six Democrats (Bayh, Landrieu, Lincoln, Ben Nelson, Pryor, and Rockefeller) voted in favor of SJ Resolution 26. Even Jay Rockefeller (D-WV), a global warming true believer, stated: "I believe we must send a strong and urgent message that the fate of our economy, our manufacturing industries, and our workers should never be placed solely in the hands of the federal Environmental Protection Agency."

Now, the Obama administration which "never wants a serious crisis to go to waste", is using the interestingly timed oil spill in the Gulf as an excuse to pass Cap and Trade, a.k.a "America's Power Act." Obama espouses the need for a "clean energy economy" and "green jobs". "Clean energy" provides about 3% of all the electricity generated in the U.S. In Spain (the model for Obama's green energy program), for every green job created with government money in the last eight years, 2.2 regular jobs were lost. With the "America's Power Act", the winners will be the investors in carbon trading, the energy companies which scored special deals with the Obama administration, and the federal government, which gets to take over another large portion of the U.S. economy. The losers will be American citizens who will see more of our freedom taken away, and our fuel and energy costs (and the costs of everything we buy) "necessarily skyrocket", to quote Obama.
