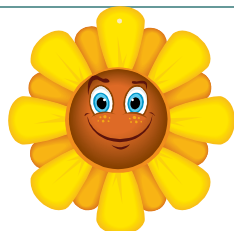
Our legislative update this month starts in South Carolina. After passing the largest state budget in history (again), our Governor vetoed 81 line items. Of those, only 30 were sustained by the House. There was a wide range of things that were vetoed, from the arts commission, "pet" projects such as a Myrtle Beach museum, and rape-crisis center funding. The arts commission was vetoed because so little of the money actually went to the arts. It was more administrative costs than anything. The museum veto was sustained. And the rape-crisis center veto was overridden. That seems great in general, except that DHEC already saw an increase in its funding for rape-prevention and the rape-crisis center was not a state agency. Many House members stood up defending certain spending and most of their statements started with, "I know this seems like a local (non-state) project, but..." There is a reason we have state, federal, and local government. Projects in Myrtle Beach should not be supported by taxpayers in Greenville county.

We have another controversy brewing in our state. A recent decision by the Budget and Control Board would increase state employees' health insurance costs. The board voted 3-2 to make this change. The controversy lies in the fact that our budget was passed with no increase for out-of-pocket costs for state workers. So this change by the board overrides the budget. Of course, this caused a stir within the legislature and is just further evidence that we're not willing to resolve our issues within our state. We are just interested in being the "winner". There is news of a potential lawsuit to reverse the decision. We will see what happens there in the coming months.

Our final piece of news is national and most likely known by most of you. Presumptive Republican nominee Mitt Romney has chosen Paul Ryan to be his running mate in the 2012 election. Ryan is a 14 year Congressman from the state of Wisconsin and was best known for writing the budget in the U.S. House that would balance the budget in 30 years. People attacked him for his proposals to change medicare and social security. My opinion is we balance the budget in 4 years and we need to make changes or else there will be no medicare or social security. So, Ryan's plan is actually quite realistic. His courage to stand up for real reform is evidence that he will be a great Vice-President pick and will rally the conservative base behind the ticket.

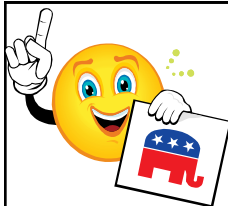
