WALK-INS: Walk-ins should be rare. After 17 walk ins last month, we have to solve this problem differently. In June, walk-ins ended up getting served before some of our members who made reservations, so when the food ran out, our members did not get their lunch in a timely fashion or perhaps not at all. Let me repeat, walk-ins should be RARE. But if it happens, here is the procedure. There will be a separate line for walkins, the cost will be \$25 and a sign will be given to put at the place where the walk-in will sit. This indicates to the server this person is to be served AFTER the ones who made reservations.


